

North-South Tollway (I-355) Intermittent Pavement Repairs

The Illinois Tollway has completed pavement repairs on several miles of the North-South Tollway (I-355) from 75th Street to the Army Trail Road Toll Plaza to provide a smoother and safer ride for Tollway customers.

Update – Latest Construction Info

Pavement repairs and resurfacing work began in August in both directions in a 14-mile stretch of the North-South Tollway (I-355) from 75th Street to the Army Trail Road Toll Plaza. Pavement repairs were completed in late October.

Minimizing Impact to Reduce Delays

All work was scheduled during overnight hours to reduce the impact to daytime and weekend traffic. Lane reductions were permitted after 8 p.m. All lanes reopened by 5 a.m. each morning.

Work Zone Safety

Schedule

Work began in late August on the south end of the North-South Tollway at the 75th Street interchange and on the Roosevelt Road ramps. The project was completed in late October.
