

Northwest Tollway (I-90) Roadway Rehabilitation From I-39 to Rockton Road

The Illinois Tollway is rehabilitating 14 miles of the Northwest Tollway (I-90) between I-39 and the Rockton Road interchange to provide a smoother and safer ride for Tollway customers.

Update – Latest Construction Info

Work began in late June in the eastbound direction in a six-mile stretch from McCurry Road to Harlem Road with overnight lane closures for pavement patching.

Minimizing Impact to Reduce Delays

All work is scheduled during overnight hours to reduce the impact to daytime and weekend traffic. Lane reductions are permitted overnight beginning at 8 p.m. and ending at 5 a.m. each morning.

Work Zone Safety

Schedule

Work began in late June in the eastbound direction, from McCurry Road heading east. Eastbound pavement repairs are scheduled to be completed by late July. Pavement patching will then begin westbound. The project is scheduled to be completed by fall of 2006.
