RAMP CLOSURES SCHEDULED NEXT WEEK AT ILLINOIS ROUTE 251 INTERCHANGE NEAR ROCHELLE ON REAGAN MEMORIAL TOLLWAY (I-88)

Off-peak full closures with detour needed for ramp pavement work as part of the I-88 Roadway Resurfacing Project

DOWNERS GROVE, IL – Daytime ramp closures are scheduled next week at the Illinois Route 251 Interchange on the Reagan Memorial Tollway (I-88) near Rochelle to complete ramp paving work. Electronic message signs and construction signage will be put in place to alert drivers in advance of the closure and detour.

Weather permitting, on Monday, April 18, the ramps from Illinois Route 251 to westbound I-88 and from eastbound I-88 to Illinois Route 251 are scheduled close from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Traffic will be detoured via the I-39 Interchange to the east. A similar closure and detour is also schedule for Tuesday, April 19.

The full closure of these ramps is needed to complete pavement repairs at Illinois Route 251 and the ramps.



Construction is being coordinated with Lee County and the Illinois Department of Transportation, along with local municipalities and police and fire departments. Up to 450 vehicles per day use the ramp carrying traffic from Illinois Route 251 to westbound I-88. Up to 390 vehicles per day use the ramp carrying traffic from eastbound I-88 to Illinois Route 251.

In 2016, the Illinois Tollway is scheduled to resurface 11 miles between U.S. Route 52 and U.S. Route 30 in Rock Falls and complete resurfacing work begun in 2015 on 21 miles of I-88 between Illinois Route 251 near Rochelle and U.S. Route 52 near Dixon, including repairs to the Illinois Route 251 Interchange, to provide a smoother riding surface for the traveling public. Work is scheduled to be complete by the end of the year.

Work Zone Safety

A 45 mph work zone speed limit will be in effect on I-88 through the construction zone. Construction zone speed limits are in effect in all construction zones 24/7 and drivers should slow down in construction zones, whether or not workers are present, watch for changing traffic patterns and use caution at all times.

Illinois State Police have zero tolerance for drivers speeding in work zones. The minimum penalty for speeding in a work zone is \$375. Posted signs advise drivers of a \$10,000 fine and 14-year jail sentence for hitting a roadway worker.
