

Move Illinois: The Illinois Tollway Driving the Future

Bridge reconstructed for I-90 Rebuilding and Widening Project

DOWNERS GROVE, IL – Reconstruction of the Higgins Road Bridge (Illinois Route 72) carrying traffic over the Jane Addams Memorial Tollway (I-90) in Hoffman Estates is nearing completion with a final traffic shift scheduled next week. The local crossroad bridge has been reconstructed to make way for the I-90 Rebuilding and Widening Project and is scheduled to be complete in early June.

Electronic message signs and construction signage will be put in place in advance to alert drivers to the traffic shift. The temporary lane closures and traffic shifts are necessary to provide a work zone and safely accommodate traffic.

Weather permitting, during the week of May 30 work to shift traffic will be scheduled between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. Eastbound traffic will shift into its final configuration with two lanes and a full shoulder. Two lanes of westbound traffic will remain shifted to the right to complete drainage work, and traffic will be shifted into its final configuration the week of June 6. All bridge work will then be complete, although daily off-peak lane closures will be scheduled through June to remove construction barriers and restore landscaping.

The Higgins Road Bridge project included construction of two new steel bridges each with two lanes and full shoulders in each direction. The new bridge also provides for room to accommodate a future bike path. Up to 24,900 vehicles use this stretch of Higgins Road daily.

The Illinois Tollway coordinated work on the project with the Illinois Department of Transportation and Cook County along with local municipalities, townships, school districts and police and fire departments.

The Higgins Road Bridge in Hoffman Estates is among four local crossroad bridges scheduled to be reconstructed along I-90 in 2016 to accommodate the new, wider I-90 roadway. Local crossroad bridge construction in 2016 also includes removal and reconstruction of the Spring Center Road Bridge and Tripp Road Bridge in Boone County and completion of work on the Higgins Road Bridge (Illinois Route 72) in Gilberts.

Altogether, 30 local bridges will be reconstructed as part of the I-90 Rebuilding and Widening Project. The I-90 Rebuilding and Widening Project is funded by the Illinois Tollway's 15-year, \$12 billion capital program, *Move Illinois: The Illinois Tollway Driving the Future*.

Work Zone Safety

The Illinois Tollway is committed to ensuring that the Higgins Road Bridge and the Jane Addams Memorial Tollway (I-90) remain safe for both drivers and workers during construction, which is part of the agency's overall commitment to roadway safety.

Construction zone speed limits are in effect in all construction zones 24/7 and drivers should continue to watch for changing traffic patterns and use caution, especially when workers are present. A 45 mph work zone speed limit is in effect on Higgins Road.

Illinois State Police have zero tolerance for drivers speeding in work zones. The minimum penalty for speeding in a work zone is \$375. Posted signs advise drivers of a \$10,000 fine and a 14-year jail sentence for hitting a roadway worker.
