WORK SCHEDULED TO BEGIN FOR REMOVAL OF ABANDONED RAILROAD CROSSING ON THE WESTERN END OF THE REAGAN MEMORIAL TOLLWAY (I-88)

Lane reductions scheduled to construct temporary pavement in preparation for traffic shift into westbound lanes near Dixon

DOWNERS GROVE, IL – The Illinois Tollway will begin work next week to prepare for the removal of two mainline bridges over an abandoned railroad track on the far western segment of the Reagan Memorial Tollway (I-88) near Dixon. Electronic message signs and construction signage will be put in place in advance to alert drivers to lane reductions and construction work zones.

As part of I-88 maintenance and improvements scheduled for 2017, the Illinois Tollway is removing two mainline bridges over an abandoned railroad crossing and constructing new roadway. Work includes pavement and shoulder reconstruction, as well as drainage, embankment and landscaping work.

Weather permitting, on Monday, May 15, at 7 a.m. the left westbound lane and shoulder from U.S. Route 52 to just beyond Illinois Route 26 will close for two weeks to prepare median crossovers that will be used for traffic shifts during construction. Traffic is scheduled to remain in this configuration until the Memorial Day weekend.

Work to remove the mainline bridges is scheduled to begin in June and continue through the end of the year. Throughout construction, traffic will be reduced to one lane in each direction and shifted onto one side of the road using the median crossovers. The closures are necessary to provide a work zone for construction and safely accommodate traffic.

In addition, traffic on eastbound I-88 is currently reduced from two lanes to one lane between U.S. Route 52 and U.S. Route 30 in Rock Falls for a roadway resurfacing project.

The lane closures and construction are being coordinated with the Illinois Department of Transportation, Lee County and local fire and police departments.

Roadway improvements on the Reagan Memorial Tollway (I-88) between U.S. Route 52 and U.S. Route 30 in Rock Falls are necessary to maintain and extend the life of the roadway and provide safe and convenient travel for Tollway customers. The work is scheduled to be complete by summer and is funded by the Illinois Tollway's 15-year, \$14 billion capital program, *Move Illinois: The Illinois Tollway Driving the Future.*

Work Zone Safety

The Illinois Tollway is committed to ensuring that the Reagan Memorial Tollway (I-88) and other area roadways remain safe for both drivers and workers during construction, which is part of the agency's overall commitment to roadway safety.

Construction zone speed limits are in effect in all construction zones 24/7 and drivers should continue to watch for changing traffic patterns and use caution, especially when workers are present. On I-88, a 45 mph work zone speed limit is in effect throughout the construction season.

Illinois State Police have zero tolerance for drivers speeding in work zones. The minimum penalty for speeding in a work zone is \$375. Posted signs advise drivers of a \$10,000 fine and a 14-year jail sentence for hitting a roadway worker.
