LOCAL ROAD CLOSURE SCHEDULED ON WOLF ROAD AT THE JANE ADDAMS MEMORIAL TOLLWAY (I-90) IN DES PLAINES

Overnight, full closure needed for storm sewer drainage improvements

DOWNERS GROVE, IL – A full closure of Wolf Road in both directions at the Jane Addams Memorial Tollway (I-90) is scheduled next week as part of roadway drainage improvements associated with the I-90 Rebuilding and Widening Project. Electronic message signs will be put in place to alert drivers in advance of the local road closure.

Construction is scheduled during overnight hours to minimize the impact on traffic. The temporary closure is necessary to provide a work zone and safely accommodate construction.

Weather permitting, on Tuesday, September 26, at 7 p.m., lane closures will begin on Wolf Road with single lane closures in both directions, followed by full closure of the roadway in both directions scheduled to begin at 10 p.m. No detour will be posted.

Wolf Road is scheduled to reopen to traffic by 5 a.m. on Wednesday, September 27, with a single northbound lane scheduled to remain closed through 8 a.m. on Friday, September 29 and a single southbound lane closure scheduled to remain in place through 5 p.m. on Sunday, October 1. The extended single lane closures are needed to give the new concrete time to cure.

The local roadway closure was coordinated with the City of Des Plaines and the Illinois Department of Transportation, along with local police and fire departments.

Work Zone Safety

The Illinois Tollway is committed to ensuring that the Jane Addams Memorial Tollway (I-90) and Wolf Road remain safe for both drivers and workers during construction, which is part of the agency's overall commitment to roadway safety.

Construction zone speed limits are in effect in all construction zones 24/7 and drivers should continue to watch for changing traffic patterns and use caution, especially when workers are present.

The Illinois Tollway reminds motorists that the "Move Over Law" requires motorists to change lanes or to slow down and proceed with caution when passing any vehicle on the side of the road with hazard lights activated. If you see flashing lights ahead, please move over or slow down.

Illinois State Police have zero tolerance for drivers speeding in work zones. The minimum penalty for speeding in a work zone is \$375. Posted signs advise drivers of a \$10,000 fine and a 14-year jail sentence for hitting a roadway worker.
