TRAFFIC SHIFT SCHEDULED TO BEGIN THIS WEEKEND ON THE SOUTH TRI-STATE TOLLWAY (I-294) AT THE LINCOLN OASIS FOR PAVEMENT WORK

Ongoing overnight lane closures continuing for roadway improvement project

DOWNERS GROVE, IL – A traffic shift is scheduled to begin this weekend and continue through the end of October on the South Tri-State Tollway (I-294/I-80) between the Lincoln Oasis and Halsted Street for roadway repairs. In addition, increased lane closures will be scheduled between the Bishop Ford Expressway and 95th Street for ongoing roadwork.

Electronic message signs and construction signage will be put in place to alert drivers in advance of traffic shifts and lane closures. The traffic shift and closures are necessary to provide a work zone that safely accommodates the construction. All work is weather dependent.

Weather permitting, at 7 p.m. on Sunday, October 15, a week-long traffic shift will begin for northbound traffic between the Lincoln Oasis and Halsted Street. No long-term lane closures are scheduled, however off-peak lane closures will continue to complete work.

In addition, lane closures in both directions between the Bishop Ford Expressway and 95th Street are scheduled to begin this weekend and continue through October to complete roadwork. The closures could include as many as three lanes closed at a time.

In 2017, the Illinois Tollway has scheduled roadway, bridge and ramp repairs on the South Tri-State Tollway (I-294/I-80) from the Bishop Ford Freeway (Illinois Route 394) to 95th Street, including work at toll plazas, as well as roadway lighting, drainage, shoulder and guardrail work. This work is scheduled to be complete by the end of the year.

The project is being coordinated with the Illinois Department of Transportation, along with local municipalities and police and fire departments.

Roadway, bridge and ramp repair work on the Tri-State Tollway is necessary to extend the life of the roadway and bridges and enable the Tollway to provide safe and convenient travel for customers. The work is part of the Illinois Tollway's 15-year, \$14 billion capital program, *Move Illinois: The Illinois Tollway Driving the Future.*

Work Zone Safety

The Illinois Tollway is committed to ensuring that the South Tri-State Tollway (I-94/I-294) and other area roadways remain safe for both drivers and workers during construction, which is part of the agency's overall commitment to roadway safety.

Construction zone speed limits are in effect in all construction zones 24/7 and drivers should continue to watch for changing traffic patterns and use caution, especially when workers are present. On I-294, a 55 mph work zone speed limit is in effect throughout the construction season.

The Illinois Tollway reminds motorists that the "Move Over Law" requires motorists to change lanes or to slow down and proceed with caution when passing any vehicle on the side of the road with hazard lights activated. If you see flashing lights ahead, please move over or slow down.

Illinois State Police have zero tolerance for drivers speeding in work zones. The minimum penalty for speeding in a work zone is \$375. Posted signs advise drivers of a \$10,000 fine and a 14-year jail sentence for hitting a roadway worker.
