ROADWAY PATCHING WORK UNDERWAY ON THE SOUTH TRI-STATE TOLLWAY (I-294/I-80)

Ongoing overnight and weekend lane closures anticipated throughout November to complete for roadway maintenance

DOWNERS GROVE, IL – Traffic shifts and ongoing overnight and weekend lane closures will be scheduled through November on the South Tri-State Tollway (I-294/I-80) between the Bishop Ford Freeway (Illinois Route 394) and Halsted Street to complete roadway maintenance work. Delays are possible and drivers are encouraged to plan additional time for travel.

Electronic message signs and construction signage will be in place to alert drivers of traffic shifts and lane closures. The traffic shift and closures are necessary to provide a work zone that safely accommodates the construction. All work is weather dependent.

Lane closures in both directions between the Bishop Ford Expressway and Halsted Street will include as many as three lanes closed at a time during overnights and weekends to accommodate pavement removal and installation and curing of concrete patches. The Tollway will reopen to four lanes in each direction during the daytime to accommodate commuter travel.

In 2017, the Illinois Tollway has scheduled roadway, bridge and ramp repairs on the South Tri-State Tollway (I-294/I-80) from the Bishop Ford Freeway (Illinois Route 394) to 95th Street, including work at toll plazas, as well as roadway lighting, drainage, shoulder and guardrail work. This work is scheduled to be complete by the end of the year.

Roadway, bridge and ramp repair work on the Tri-State Tollway is necessary to extend the life of the roadway and bridges and enable the Tollway to provide safe and convenient travel for customers. The work is part of the Illinois Tollway's 15-year, \$14 billion capital program, *Move Illinois: The Illinois Tollway Driving the Future.*

Work Zone Safety

The Illinois Tollway is committed to ensuring that the South Tri-State Tollway (I-94/I-294) and other area roadways remain safe for both drivers and workers during construction, which is part of the agency's overall commitment to roadway safety.

Construction zone speed limits are in effect in all construction zones 24/7 and drivers should continue to watch for changing traffic patterns and use caution, especially when workers are present. On I-294, a 55 mph work zone speed limit is in effect throughout the construction season.

The Illinois Tollway reminds motorists that the "Move Over Law" requires motorists to change lanes or to slow down and proceed with caution when passing any vehicle on the side of the road with hazard lights activated. If you see flashing lights ahead, please move over or slow down.

Illinois State Police have zero tolerance for drivers speeding in work zones. The minimum penalty for speeding in a work zone is \$375. Posted signs advise drivers of a \$10,000 fine and a 14-year jail sentence for hitting a roadway worker.
