

Minutes of the

Finance, Administration and Operations Committee Meeting

Record of Meeting | August 19, 2015

The Illinois State Toll Highway Authority (the "Tollway") held the Finance, Administration and Operations Committee Meeting on Wednesday, August 19, 2015 at Tollway Headquarters in Downers Grove, Illinois. The Meeting was held pursuant to By-Laws of the Tollway upon call and notice of the Meeting executed by Chairman Robert J. Schillerstrom and posted in accordance with the requirements of the Illinois *Open Meetings Act*. The Meeting was open to the public.

[Bolded entries indicate issues which may require follow-up to present or report to Directors.]

Call to Order / Roll Call

Committee Chair Joe Gomez called the Meeting to order at approximately 9:12 a.m. and stated that this is the regularly scheduled meeting of the Finance, Administration and Operations Committee of the Tollway Board of Directors. He then asked the Board Secretary to call the roll, those Directors present and absent being as follows:

The Board Secretary declared a quorum present.

Public Comment

Committee Chair Gomez opened the floor for public comment. No public comment was offered.

Committee Chair's Items

Committee Chair Gomez called for a motion to allow the non-voting participation in the work of the Committee this day by Director Corey Brooks, newly-appointed to the Tollway Board of



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Directors. Director Sauer made such a motion; seconded by Director Dotson. The motion was approved unanimously.

Committee Chair Gomez then called for a motion to approve the Minutes of the Finance, Administration and Operations Committee ("FAO Committee") meeting held on May 20, 2015. Director Sauer made a motion for approval; seconded by Director Dotson. The motion was approved unanimously.

Committee Chair Gomez welcomed Directors Dotson and Sauer, both newly-assigned to the FAO Committee, as well as Director Corey Brooks, recently nominated to the FAO Committee. He noted that formal approval of Director Brooks' committee assignment is to be considered at the August Board of Directors meeting.

Committee Chair Gomez then called on Greg Bedalov, Executive Director.

Executive Director's Items

2015 Traffic Update: Executive Director Bedalov provided a summary of toll transaction results for the second quarter of 2015, highlighting that the current summer travel season has been the busiest in Tollway history. See attached presentation.

Director Sauer, first commenting positively on the record-breaking toll transactions achieved in 2015, asked the address of the Tollway's Twitter account. Joelle McGinnis, Press Secretary, responded that the Tollway maintains four Twitter feeds (links are available on the Tollway's website), one for each of the agency's tollways, which customers can "follow" to receive tailored real-time roadway incident information.

Director Sauer asked if the agency makes broadly available current Tollway system travel times so that customers can plan accordingly prior to departure and, if so, what outreach is performed to make customers aware that this information is available. Ms. McGinnis responded that Tollway travel times are posted on www.travelmidwest.com, a travel information portal made available through a coalition of Midwest transportation agencies. She further stated that the addresses of Tollway travel information resources are shared with partnering regional news outlets, which then disseminate this information to the public during broadcast programing. She emphasized that any suggestions by Directors for methods to enhance outreach efforts are welcomed.

Managing Construction Changes and I-90 Progress: Executive Director Bedalov then introduced Paul Kovacs, Chief Engineer, to present an overview of how the Tollway manages



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construction changes and of progress on the eastern segment of the Jane Addams Memorial Tollway (I-90) Rebuilding and Widening Project. See attached presentation.

Committee Chair Gomez asked how timetables have been impacted by recent legislation requiring that change orders / extra works orders in excess of \$30,000 be reviewed for approval by an independent State Procurement Officer ("SPO"). Mr. Kovacs responded that the additional level of review has added time to the procurement process; however, the assigned SPO has been responsive to the time sensitivity of the Tollway's construction schedules, typically granting waivers in a matter of days.

Director Dotson, first commenting positively that change orders / extra work orders represent just 0.4 percent of total construction awards, requested confirmation that the change orders / extra work orders brought to Committee for consideration are those that exceed the \$200,000 approval thresholds of senior management. Mr. Kovacs confirmed.

Release of Retainage Policy: Executive Director Bedalov then re-introduced Mr. Kovacs to present an overview of the Tollway's release of retainage policy and to identify particular elements therein which may benefit from revision. <u>See attached presentation</u>.

During the presentation, Mr. Kovacs highlighted that in addition to retainage, performance bonds are also a requirement of Tollway construction contracts, providing the Tollway with further guarantees of satisfactory completion of projects by vendors.

Director Dotson asked staff to elaborate on the advantages to potentially eliminating the practice of attaining Board approval for releases of retainage. Mr. Kovacs responded that currently, once the Tollway has certified that all completed work has been performed in accordance with contract requirements, release of vendor earnings withheld is delayed for up to an additional 30 days until approval can be attained at the subsequent Board of Directors meeting. He explained that the proposed policy modification would allow releases of retainage to be executed by senior management upon the Tollway's acceptance of the completed work, thereby providing primes and consequently their subcontractors more timely receipt of compensation due them. He noted that subcontractors, including disadvantaged business enterprises ("DBEs"), can often be adversely impacted by payment delays. Mr. Kovacs emphasized that the Board receives quarterly Capital Program Reports, which will continue to detail all releases of retainage as well as final vendor performance in meeting Tollway contract requirements, including their Diversity Program commitments.



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Director Sauer asked if the original rationale is known for instituting the requirement for Board approval of releases of retainage. Executive Director Bedalov responded that current management does not have that background.

Committee Chair Gomez expressed the consensus of the Committee that staff further develop the proposed modifications to the Tollway's retainage policy and upon completion, present their recommendations for policy amendments to the full Board of Directors. Committee Chair Gomez suggested that staff also explore policy modifications which might provide the Tollway with means to promote and safeguard the timely payment by primes of subcontractors, particularly DBEs.

Quarterly Financial Review: Executive Director Bedalov then introduced Mike Colsch, Chief of Finance, to present the Quarterly Financial Review covering the preliminary budget to actual results for the second quarter ending June 30, 2015. See attached presentation.

Committee Chair Gomez congratulated Mr. Colsch and his staff for a successful quarter and for their efforts in compilation of the information. He then inquired about the low staffing levels at the agency, particularly vacancies in critical job roles. Executive Director Bedalov responded that staffing of these positions is a priority for the Tollway and efforts are underway, including job postings to be issued imminently for several critical hires.

Committee Chair Gomez then called on John Donato, Chief of Procurement, to present the following **Procurement** Items:

<u>Item 1</u>: Renewal of Contract 14-0104 to Energy Absorption Systems, Inc. for the purchase of Crash Attenuator Parts in an amount not to exceed \$200,000.00 (Order Against CMS Master Contract).

<u>Item 2</u>: Award of Contract 13-0218 to SDI Solutions LLC for the purchase of Technology Professional Services in an amount not to exceed \$11,870,000.00 (Tollway Request for Proposals).

<u>Item 3</u>: Amendment of Contract 12-0267 to e-Builder, Inc. for the purchase of a Web-Based Project Management System in an amount not to exceed \$187,740.00 (Tollway Request for Proposals).







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Item 4: Award of Contract 15-0078 to Aptude, Inc. for the purchase of Hewlett-Packard Software, Licenses, Maintenance, and Support in an amount not to exceed \$219,086.58 (Tollway Invitation for Bids).

Item 5: Award of Contract 15-0020 to Henderson Products, Inc. (d.b.a. Henderson Truck Equipment-IL) for the purchase of Salt Brine Machines in an amount not to exceed \$241,000.00 (Tollway Invitation for Bids).

Item 6: Award of Contract 13-0251R to Industrial Fence, Inc. for the purchase of Trinity Guardrail Parts in an amount not to exceed \$210,199.55 (Tollway Invitation for Bids).

Item 7: Award of Contract 15-0004R to Maggio Truck Center, Inc.; Hillside Auto Body & Service, Inc.; O'Hare Towing Service, Inc.; Naperville Towing Service, Inc.; Suburban Towing, Inc.; and Ernie's Wrecker Service, Inc. for the purchase of Towing and Road Services for Tollway Vehicles and Equipment in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$205,723.30 (Tollway Invitation for Bids).

Mr. Donato noted that the award amount for Procurement Item 7 has been revised from \$204,056.30, the amount listed on the posted Meeting agenda, to an aggregate amount not to exceed \$205,723.30.

Item 8: Award of Contract 15-0037 to Atlas Stationers, Inc. for the purchase of Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM) Printer Cartridges in an amount not to exceed \$121,050.00 (Tollway Invitation for Bids).

Item 9: Award of Contract 13-0216R to Construction Materials & Supply Resources LLC for the purchase of Lumber and Plywood in an amount not to exceed \$126,594.90 (Tollway Invitation for Bids).

Committee Chair Gomez called for a motion to approve placement on the August Board of Directors meeting agenda of Procurement Items 1 through 9 with the Committee's recommendation. Director Sauer made a motion for approval; seconded by Director Dotson. Committee Chair Gomez asked if there were any questions, concerns or requests for discussion.

Director Dotson asked why Diversity Program goals of 0 percent were established for Items 5 and 7. Mr. Donato responded that the Tollway's goal setting process was employed; however, there were no certified disadvantaged business enterprises located which offer the specialized salt brine equipment required in Item 5. Gustavo Giraldo, Chief of Diversity and Strategic Minutes of the

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Development, responded that a similar circumstance existed when establishing participation goals for Item 7.

Director Sauer asked whether salt brine machines, provided for in Item 5, have been used previously on the Tollway system. Mr. Donato responded in the negative.

Director Sauer, referencing Item 8, asked why the Tollway does not use a uniform printer model throughout the agency. Mr. Donato responded that agency printers have been accumulated over a number of years using Illinois Department of Central Management Services master contracts which are awarded to the lowest bidder, accounting for the varied models and manufacturers.

Hearing no further questions, Committee Chair Gomez called for a vote on the pending motion. The motion was approved unanimously.

Committee Chair Gomez then called on Paul Kovacs, Chief Engineer, to present the following **Engineering** Items:

<u>Item 1</u>: Award of Contract I-15-4652 to Fox Excavating, Inc. for Building Removal on the North-South bypass of the Elgin O'Hare Western Access (EOWA) Corridor from Milepost 0.1 (Powell Street) to Milepost 0.8 (Franklin Avenue) in the amount of \$866,429.00.

<u>Item 2</u>: Acceptance of Proposal from BV3 LLC, a Joint Venture on Contract I-11-4018 for Supplemental Design Services for Reconstruction and Add Lane on the Jane Addams Memorial Tollway (I-90) from Milepost 78.6 (Kennedy Expressway) to Milepost 53.8 (Elgin Toll Plaza) and Milepost 60.8 (Higgins Road) to Milepost 53.8 (Elgin Toll Plaza), in the amount of \$1,207,809.00 from \$26,899,338.80 to \$28,107,147.80.



<u>Item 14</u>: Change Order on Contract I-13-4600 to Lorig Construction Company, for Roadway and Bridge Construction on Illinois Route 390 at Milepost 12.1 (Rohlwing Road), in the amount of \$442,200.00.

Committee Chair Gomez inquired whether subcontractors have received full payment from the prime for their completed work on the contract. Mr. Kovacs responded that payment of some subcontractors may be pending receipt by the prime contractor of retainage held by the Tollway.

Mr. Kovacs requested that consideration of Engineering Items 21 and 22 be deferred to Executive Session of the August Board of Directors meeting.

Committee Chair Gomez stated that without objection, for purposes of voting he will group together Engineering items by type.

Committee Chair Gomez then called for a motion to approve placement on the August Board of Directors meeting agenda of Engineering Item 1 with the Committee's recommendation. Director Dotson made a motion for approval; seconded by Director Sauer. Committee Chair Gomez asked if there were any questions, concerns or requests for discussion. Hearing none, Committee Chair Gomez called for a vote. The motion was approved unanimously.

Committee Chair Gomez called for a motion to approve placement on the August Board of Directors meeting agenda of Engineering Item 2 with the Committee's recommendation. Director Sauer made a motion for approval; seconded by Director Dotson. Committee Chair Gomez asked if there were any questions, concerns or requests for discussion. Hearing none, Committee Chair Gomez called for a vote. The motion was approved unanimously.

Noting that these Engineering items are extra work orders or change orders, Committee Chair Gomez called for a motion to approve placement on the August Board of Directors meeting agenda of Engineering Items 3 through 16 with the Committee's recommendation. Director Sauer made a motion for approval; seconded by Director Dotson. Committee Chair Gomez asked if there were any questions, concerns or requests for discussion. Hearing none, Committee Chair Gomez called for a vote. The motion was approved unanimously.

Noting that these Engineering items are releases of retainage, Committee Chair Gomez called for a motion to approve placement on the August Board of Directors meeting agenda of Engineering Items 17 through 20 with the Committee's recommendation. Director Sauer made a motion for approval; seconded by Director Dotson. Committee Chair Gomez asked if there



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were any questions, concerns or requests for discussion. Hearing none, Committee Chair Gomez called for a vote. The motion was approved unanimously.

Committee Chair Gomez stated that Engineering Items 21 and 22 will be deferred to Executive Session of the August Board of Directors meeting.

Committee Chair Gomez then called on David Goldberg, General Counsel, to present the following **Legal** Items:

<u>Item 1</u>: An Intergovernmental Agreement with the City of Wood Dale regarding Mittel Drive. Cost to the Tollway: \$0

<u>Item 2</u>: An Intergovernmental Agreement with the County of DuPage, Elk Grove Village and City of Wood Dale regarding the Lively Boulevard bridge project. Cost to the Tollway: \$0

<u>Item 3</u>: A Litigation Settlement – Rhino Foods (Property Damage). Cost to the Tollway: As discussed in Executive Session.

<u>Item 4</u>: Litigation Settlement – Land Acquisition for the Elgin O'Hare Western Access project for Parcel No. EO-1B-12-007. Cost to the Tollway: As discussed in Executive Session.

Mr. Goldberg requested that consideration of Legal items 3 and 4 be deferred to Executive Session of the August Board of Directors meeting.

Committee Chair Gomez then called for a motion to approve placement on the August Board of Directors meeting agenda of **Legal Items 1 and 2** with the Committee's recommendation. Director Sauer made a motion for approval; seconded by Director Dotson. Committee Chair Gomez asked if there were any questions, concerns or requests for discussion. Hearing none, Committee Chair Gomez called for a vote. The motion was approved unanimously.

Committee Chair Gomez stated that Legal Items 3 and 4 will be deferred to Executive Session of the August Board of Directors meeting.

Adjournment

There being no further business, Committee Chair Gomez requested a motion to adjourn. Motion to adjourn was made by Director Sauer; seconded by Director Dotson. The motion was approved unanimously.






- Traffic rebound started in 2010






- Recent quarterly car growth most since 2010
- Continued truck growth








 Chicago Metropolitan Statistical Area vs. Regional and National

Release of Retainage

August 19, 2015

Rules of Retainage



- Required by the Tollway's Trust Indenture and specifications
- Retainage requirements
 - Ten percent of each payment amount retained until project is 50 percent complete
 - Upon completion of 50 percent of the work, retainage can be reduced with the Chief Engineer's approval
 - Partial release of retainage less than 5 percent requires Board approval
 - Final release of retainage requires Board approval
- Detailed review process prior to Board approval
- Ensures contract compliance and completion by the contractor
- Diversity goals must be addressed prior to final payment
- Evaluating modifications to expedite the process





Contract award for \$10 million

Award

- 10 percent of each payment is retained until the work is 50 percent complete
- At 50 percent complete (\$5 million), \$500,000 has been retained

50%


- Once 50 percent complete, contractor may request no additional retainage be withheld on subsequent payments
- Chief Engineer approval is required

Partial

- Towards the end of the contract, \$100,000 of work remains
- Contractor may request partial release withheld; minimum retainage of \$100,000 x 2 = \$200,000
- Board approval required to release \$300,000 of retainage

Final

- All work is completed, reviewed and deemed acceptable
- Board approval required to release \$200,000 remaining retainage

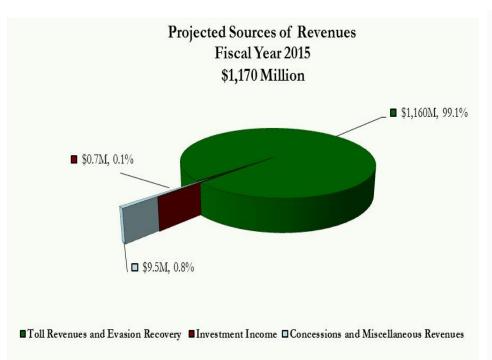


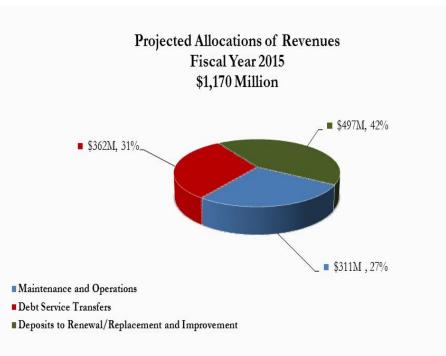
2015 Second Quarter Budget to Actual Review

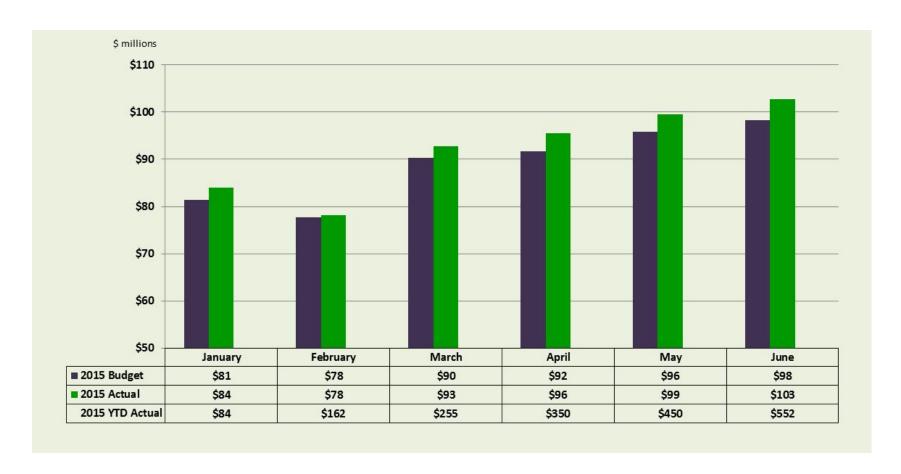

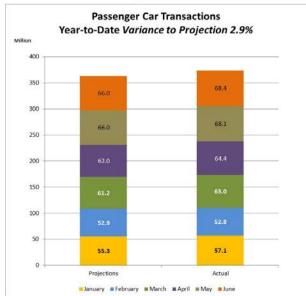



2015 vs. 2014 Transactions - Projections vs. Actual




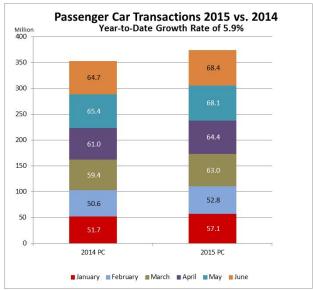







2015 vs. 2014 Transactions — Year-Over-Year

Managing Construction Changes

August 19, 2015

Change is Common



- Construction contract changes occur for a variety of reasons
 - Differing site conditions (unsuitable soil, unidentified utilities, etc.)
 - Specification changes
 - Schedule changes
 - Balancing for final field measurements
 - Errors and omissions
 - Miscellaneous (such as weather)
- Timely approvals are crucial to project delivery
 - Capital program investing about \$6 to \$8 million per day
- Details reported to the Board of Directors each month
- Illinois Tollway's change process is very effective
 - National average for highway construction is 5 to 10 percent compared to current Tollway capital program average of 0.4 percent*

- Contract Cost Change Controls Committee (C5)
 - Reviews and recommends construction contract changes
 - Reviewed by Chief Engineer (approve, reject, revise/resubmit)
 - Delegates signature authority per value of change
- Committee composition
 - Chairman appointed by the Chief Engineer

Two members appointed by the C5 Chairman (typically Tollway)












Reputation for successfully delivering projects

- Delivered 80 percent of the 10-year Congestion-Relief Program in the first five years
 - Processed nearly 14,000 change orders/extra work orders
 - Resulted in modified cost less than one percent of total award amount
- Successfully delivered 37-mile I-90 western segment
 - Opened on time despite initial delays ranging from 15 to 118 days
 - Implemented successful mitigation strategy
 - Resulted in 2.67 percent (\$15 million) below established budget




Jane Addams Memorial Tollway (I-90) Eastern Segment Construction Update

August 19, 2015



- MOVE
- Rebuilding and widening 25 miles from six lanes to eight lanes
 - ▶ 28 bridges, including six interchanges
 - Urban region, with more than 270,000 vehicles per day
- Incorporating transit for the first time
- Implementing active traffic management (ATM) for the first time
- Addressing unique challenges throughout corridor







Initial delays had a ripple effect – from advance work contracts to current contracts

- U.S. Army Corps of Engineers permit delayed, required to begin work in regulated areas
- Major utilities serving more than 500,000 people run parallel to the corridor
 - Highly complex work
 - Restrictive work rules limit productivity
 - Utility firms have limited resources available
- Limited access to work zone
 - Delays in third party utility relocations
 - Delays obtaining right-of-way and required rights-of-entry
- Significant weather impacts

Mitigating Delays for the Customers



Tollway is committed to delivering improvements on time and within budget

- Tollway is customer-focused
 - Minimizing impacts during construction
 - Making improvements in timely manner
- Coordinating with industry to develop solutions
 - Meeting with various stakeholders from every level
 - Developing consistent, yet individual solutions across the corridor
 - Mitigation strategies may include:
 - Re-phasing and re-sequencing to prioritize mainline
 - Schedule recovery (extended hours/weekends)
 - Mobilization/remobilization
 - Extension of time for non-roadway work items
 - Winter protection for some work items




- Implement mitigation plans for each contract
 - Propose consistent, yet individual solutions
 - Continue coordination with industry
 - Represented in change orders/extra work orders
- Advertise 2016 construction contracts in August/September 2015
- Deliver eight lanes by end of 2016 within budget

Quick Summary



- I-90 change orders and extra work orders are within budget
 - 2015 budget for I-90 is \$839.6 million
 - Cost of mitigation plans for I-90 are 1.9 percent of the 2015 budget
 - Operating within the \$2.5 billion I-90 Rebuilding and Widening Project budget
- To date, capital program change orders/extra work orders account for 0.4 percent of total contract awards
