Minutes of the 1 2016 Finance, Administration & Operations Committee Meeting

Record of Meeting | March 16, 2016

The Illinois State Toll Highway Authority (the "Tollway") held the regularly scheduled Finance, Administration and Operations Committee Meeting on Wednesday, March 16, 2016 in the Boardroom of Tollway Headquarters in Downers Grove, Illinois. The Meeting was held pursuant to By-Laws of the Tollway upon call and notice of the Meeting executed by Chairman Robert J. Schillerstrom and posted in accordance with the requirements of the Illinois *Open Meetings Act.* The Meeting was open to the public.

Call to Order / Pledge of Allegiance / Roll Call

Committee Chair Joe Gomez called the Meeting to order at approximately 9:36 a.m., stating that this is the regularly scheduled meeting of the Finance, Administration and Operations Committee ("FAO Committee") of the Tollway Board of Directors. He invited attendees to rise and join in the Pledge of Allegiance. He then asked the Board Secretary to call the roll, those Directors present and absent being as follows:

The Board Secretary declared a quorum present.

Public Comment

Committee Chair Gomez opened the floor for public comment. No public comment was offered.

Committee Chair's Items

Committee Chair Gomez called for a motion to approve the Minutes of the regular Finance, Administration and Operations Committee meeting held on February 18, 2016, as presented. Director Sauer made a motion for approval; seconded by Director Dotson. Committee Chair Gomez then called for a vote. The motion PASSED unanimously.



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Having no further items, Committee Chair Gomez called on Executive Director Greg Bedalov.

Executive Director's Items

Quarterly Financial Review: Executive Director Bedalov introduced Mike Colsch, Chief of Finance, to present a Quarterly Financial Review covering the preliminary 2015 Year-ending Budget to Actual results. <u>See attached presentation</u>.

Director Dotson asked for clarification of the cause for capital program expenses exceeding the revised Budget estimates. Mr. Colsch responded that the negative variance is primarily related to timing of utilities and right-of-way expenditures (not unanticipated costs) for the Elgin O'Hare Western Access Project. He explained that the Budget estimates were constructed based on the historically slow invoicing of the Tollway by utilities for costs related to utility relocations; however, successful efforts by the Finance and Engineering Departments to improve timeliness has allowed the (more appropriate) recognition of these costs earlier in the process.

Items for Consideration

Finance

Committee Chair Gomez called on Mike Colsch, Chief of Finance, to present to the Committee the following Finance item:

<u>Item 1</u>: Award of Contract 16-0028 to Mesirow Insurance Services for the purchase of Liability Insurance Services in an amount not to exceed \$994,401.00 (Order Against CMS Master Contract).

Committee Chair Gomez called for a motion to approve placement of **Finance Item 1** on the March Board of Directors meeting agenda with the Committee's recommendation for approval by the Board. Director Sauer made a motion for approval; seconded by Director Dotson. Committee Chair Gomez asked if there are any questions, concerns or requests for discussion.

Director Sauer inquired about the contract length with Mesirow Insurance Services, which brokered the liability insurance policies proposed for acceptance. Mr. Colsch responded that Mesirow is engaged under a Department of Central Management Services ("CMS") master contract for brokerage services which the Tollway utilized to solicit and negotiate one year of liability insurance coverages. John Hauk, Insurance Risk Manager, added that the CMS master contract with Mesirow Insurance Services expires in 2017, after which renewal options are available to CMS.

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Hearing nothing further, Committee Chair Gomez called for a vote on the pending motion. The motion PASSED unanimously.

Procurement

Committee Chair Gomez called on John Donato, Chief of Procurement, to present to the Committee the following Procurement items:

<u>Item 1</u>: Award of Contract 15-0166 to L&M Solutions, Inc. for the purchase of a Tower Aviation Lighting Upgrade in an amount not to exceed \$399,495.00 (Order Against CMS Master Contract).

<u>Item 2</u>: Award of Contract 13-0052R to Keizer Morris International, Inc. (d.b.a. KM International, Inc.) for the purchase of Asphalt-Repair Equipment in an amount not to exceed \$154,580.00 (Tollway Invitation for Bids).

<u>Item 3</u>: Renewal of Contract 09-0015 to Infor Public Sector, Inc. for the purchase of Computer-Aided Dispatch System Software and Hardware Maintenance in an amount not to exceed \$129,000.00 (Tollway Sole Source).

Upon conclusion of the presentation of items by Mr. Donato, Committee Chair Gomez called for a motion to consolidate for consideration and action Procurement Items 1 through 3. Director Brooks made a motion to consolidate; seconded by Director Sauer. Committee Chair Gomez then called for a vote. The motion PASSED unanimously.

The motion to consolidate these items having carried, Committee Chair Gomez called for a motion to approve placement of **Procurement Items 1 through 3** on the March Board of Directors meeting agenda with the Committee's recommendation for approval by the Board. Director Brooks made a motion for approval; seconded by Director Sauer. Committee Chair Gomez asked if there are any questions, concerns or requests for discussion. Hearing nothing, Committee Chair Gomez then called for a vote. The motion PASSED unanimously.

Engineering

Committee Chair Gomez called on Paul Kovacs, Chief Engineer, to present to the Committee the following Engineering items:

<u>Item 1</u>: Award of Contract I-16-4261 to Lorig Construction Company for Roadway and Bridge Repairs on the Jane Addams Memorial Tollway (I-90) from Milepost 19.75 (West of US Route 20) to Milepost 52.5 (East of Randall Road) in the amount of \$1,843,769.80.

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Director Gomez commended the vendor's commitment to 14.5% participation of certified veteran small businesses ("VSBs"). Mr. Kovacs highlighted that prime contractors, now mindful of the Tollway's VSB goals, are reaching out to more VSBs.

<u>Item 2</u>: Award of Contract I-15-4662 to Plote Construction, Inc. for Advance Earthwork and South Frontage Road Construction on the Elgin O'Hare Western Access (IL 390) from Milepost 16.2 (Supreme Drive) to Milepost 16.9 (York Road) in the amount of \$23,058,290.51.

<u>Item 3</u>: Award of Contract I-15-4248 to Lorig Construction Company for Bridge Reconstruction and Interchange Improvements on the Reagan Memorial Tollway (I-88) Farnsworth Avenue over I-88, Milepost 114.35 (Orchard Road) to Milepost 122.1 (North Eola Road) in the amount of \$14,600,527.78.

<u>Item 4</u>: Award of Contract RR-15-4230R to Aldridge Electric, Inc. for Maintenance Garage Fuel Dispensing Systems, Anti-Freeze Tanks, and Liquid Chloride Storage Tanks, Systemwide, in the amount of \$2,603,185.80.

Director Dotson inquired about the life-cycle of the storage tanks proposed for replacement. **Mr. Kovacs responded that this information will be provided for Directors post-meeting.**

<u>Item 5</u>: Acceptance of Proposal from BCP Tollway Partners (JV) on Contract I-13-4100 for Supplemental Construction Management Services on the Jane Addams Memorial Tollway (I-90) from Milepost 70.7 (Arlington Heights Road) to Milepost 73.3 (East of Oakton Street), in an amount not to exceed \$170,000.00.

<u>Item 6</u>: Acceptance of Proposal from Patrick Engineering, Inc. / Civiltech Engineering, Inc. / Singh & Associates, Inc., (JV) on Contract I-12-4041 for Supplemental Design Services on the Elgin O'Hare Western Access (EOWA), U.S. Route 20 to Illinois Route 83, in an amount not to exceed \$900,000.00.

<u>Item 7</u>: Change Order / Extra Work Order on Contract I-14-4209 to Walsh Construction Company II, LLC / K-Five Construction Corporation (JV) for Outside Roadway and Bridge Reconstruction and Widening on the Jane Addams Memorial Tollway (I-90) from Milepost 70.7 (Arlington Heights Road) to Milepost 73.3 (Oakton Street), in the amount of \$2,576,026.39.

<u>Item 8</u>: Change Order / Extra Work Order on Contract I-14-4208 to Walsh Construction Company II, LLC / K-Five Construction Corporation (JV) for Outside Roadway and Bridge Reconstruction and Widening on the Jane Addams Memorial Tollway (I-90) from Milepost 68.1 (I-290/IL-53) to Milepost 70.7 (Arlington Heights Road), in the amount of \$2,555,725.72.

Director Sauer asked for further explanation of the cause for the change order portion of the proposed change order / extra work order. Mr. Kovacs responded that the change order portions



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of both Items 7 and 8 are to provide for additional quantities needed to perform the work as shown on the design plans. He explained that insufficient quantities in these contracts resulted from a design omission. Mr. Kovacs emphasized that the Tollway has a robust review process and the design omission was identified as a potential Errors and Omissions item for further evaluation and possible cost recovery. He noted, however, that the needed additional quantities were procured under competitive bid unit costs established within the respective contracts, so the Tollway only paid for needed material at appropriate rates. Mr. Kovacs advised that the change order / extra work order was further evaluated under the agency's construction claims process, which identified process violations anticipated to result in sanctions being imposed by the Tollway.

Director Sauer asked about the Tollway's protocols for reviewing submitted design plans to ensure their accuracy. Mr. Kovacs responded that while some targeted review is performed throughout the design and construction process, the Tollway relies generally on the competencies of the professional engineering firms contracted to perform the design work. He noted that the Errors and Omission process has been established to ensure cost recovery is made if the agency suffers harm.

<u>Item 9</u>: Change Order / Extra Work Order on Contract I-14-4648 to Benchmark Construction Co., Inc. for Northwest Suburban Municipal Joint Action Water Agency (NSMJAWA) Water Main Relocation on the Jane Addams Memorial Tollway (I-90) from Milepost 73.5 (Elmhurst Road) to Milepost 74.3 (Higgins Creek), in the amount of \$650,000.00.

<u>Item 10</u>: Resolution Authorizing Release of Funds for Utility and Fiber Optic Relocation for the Elgin O'Hare Western Access (EOWA), Project I-11-4005.

<u>Item 11</u>: Land Acquisition (Identification of Real Estate Parcels associated with the Elgin O'Hare Western Access Project). Cost to the Tollway: N/A.

Mr. Kovacs requested that consideration of Engineering Item 11, related to land acquisition activities, be deferred until the Executive Session of the March Board of Directors meeting.

Upon conclusion of the presentation of items by Mr. Kovacs, Committee Chair Gomez called for a motion to consolidate for consideration and action Engineering Items 1 through 4, each a construction contract. Director Sauer made a motion to consolidate; seconded by Director Brooks. Committee Chair Gomez then called for a vote. The motion PASSED unanimously.

The motion to consolidate these items having carried, Committee Chair Gomez called for a motion to approve placement of **Engineering Items 1 through 4** on the March Board of Directors meeting agenda with the Committee's recommendation for approval by the Board. Director Sauer made a motion for approval; seconded by Director Dotson. Committee Chair Gomez asked if

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there are any questions, concerns or requests for discussion. Hearing nothing, Committee Chair Gomez called for a vote. The motion PASSED unanimously.

Committee Chair Gomez called for a motion to consolidate for consideration and action Engineering Items 5 and 6, each a professional services contract. Director Dotson made a motion to consolidate; seconded by Director Sauer. Committee Chair Gomez then called for a vote. The motion PASSED unanimously.

The motion to consolidate these items having carried, Committee Chair Gomez called for a motion to approve placement of **Engineering Items 5 and 6** on the March Board of Directors meeting agenda with the Committee's recommendation for approval by the Board. Director Dotson made a motion for approval; seconded by Director Sauer. Committee Chair Gomez asked if there are any questions, concerns or requests for discussion. Hearing nothing, Committee Chair Gomez called for a vote. The motion PASSED unanimously.

Committee Chair Gomez called for a motion to consolidate for consideration and action Engineering Items 7 through 9, each of which is a change order / extra work order. Director Brooks made a motion to consolidate; seconded by Director Sauer. Committee Chair Gomez then called for a vote. The motion PASSED unanimously.

The motion to consolidate these items having carried, Committee Chair Gomez called for a motion to approve placement of **Engineering Items 7 through 9** on the March Board of Directors meeting agenda with the Committee's recommendation for approval by the Board. Director Sauer made a motion for approval; seconded by Director Dotson. Committee Chair Gomez asked if there are any questions, concerns or requests for discussion. Hearing nothing, Committee Chair Gomez called for a vote. The motion PASSED unanimously.

Committee Chair Gomez called for a motion to approve placement of **Engineering Item 10**, a release of funds for utility and fiber optic relocation, on the March Board of Directors meeting agenda with the Committee's recommendation for approval by the Board. Director Sauer made a motion for approval; seconded by Director Dotson. Committee Chair Gomez asked if there are any questions, concerns or requests for discussion. Hearing nothing, Committee Chair Gomez called for a vote. The motion PASSED unanimously.

Committee Chair Gomez stated that consideration of **Engineering Item 11** will be deferred until the Executive Session of the March Board of Directors meeting.

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Committee Chair Gomez called on David Goldberg, General Counsel, to present to the Committee the following Legal items:

<u>Item 1</u>: An Intergovernmental Agreement with the Illinois Department of Transportation, Elk Grove Village, Village of Mount Prospect and City of Des Plaines in connection with improvements to Elgin O'Hare Western Bypass over I-90 west of Elmhurst Road including requested improvements from Elk Grove Village. Cost to the Tollway: \$ 0

<u>Item 2</u>: An Intergovernmental Agreement with the Illinois Department of Transportation (Bridge No. 625) to reconstruct Illinois Route 72 bridge over I-90. Cost to the Tollway: \$ 0

<u>Item 3</u>: An Intergovernmental Agreement with the Illinois Department of Transportation (Bridge No. 513 & 513A) to replace Illinois Route 72 bridges over I-90. Cost to the Tollway: \$ 0

<u>Item 4</u>: An Intergovernmental Agreement with the Illinois Department of Transportation and Village of Rosemont for the sharing of costs associated with the reconstruction of the Lee Street Bridge over I-90. Cost to the Tollway: \$ 0

<u>Item 5</u>: A Worker's Compensation Settlement – Richard Hoepner. Cost to the Tollway: As discussed in Executive Session.

Upon conclusion of the presentation of items by Mr. Goldberg, Committee Chair Gomez called for a motion to consolidate for consideration and action Legal Items 1 through 4, each an intergovernmental agreement. Director Sauer made a motion to consolidate; seconded by Director Dotson. Committee Chair Gomez then called for a vote. The motion PASSED unanimously.

The motion to consolidate these items having carried, Committee Chair Gomez then called for a motion to approve placement of **Legal Items 1 through 4** on the March Board of Directors meeting agenda with the Committee's recommendation for approval by the Board. Director Sauer made a motion for approval; seconded by Director Brooks. Committee Chair Gomez asked if there are any questions, concerns or requests for discussion. Hearing nothing, Committee Chair Gomez called for a vote. The motion PASSED unanimously.

Committee Chair Gomez stated that consideration of **Legal Item 5** will be deferred until the Executive Session of the March Board of Directors meeting.

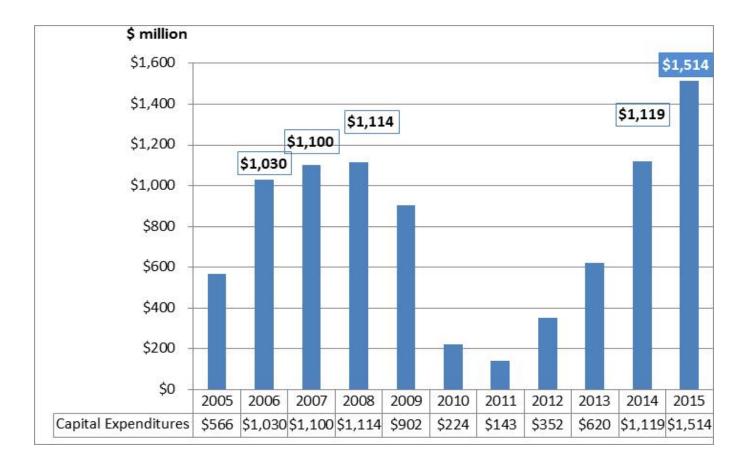

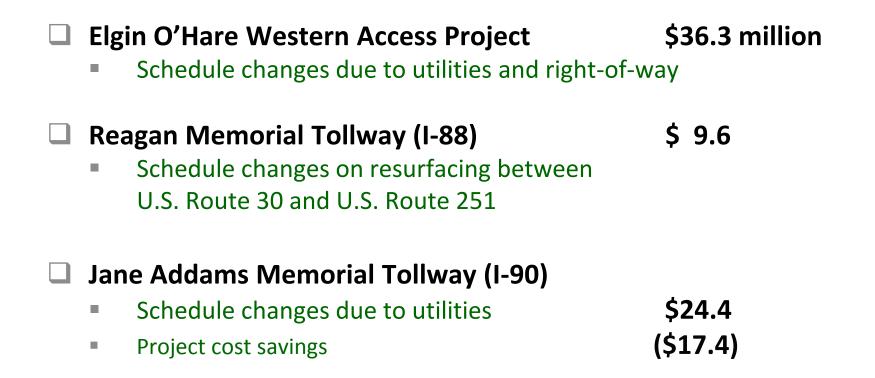

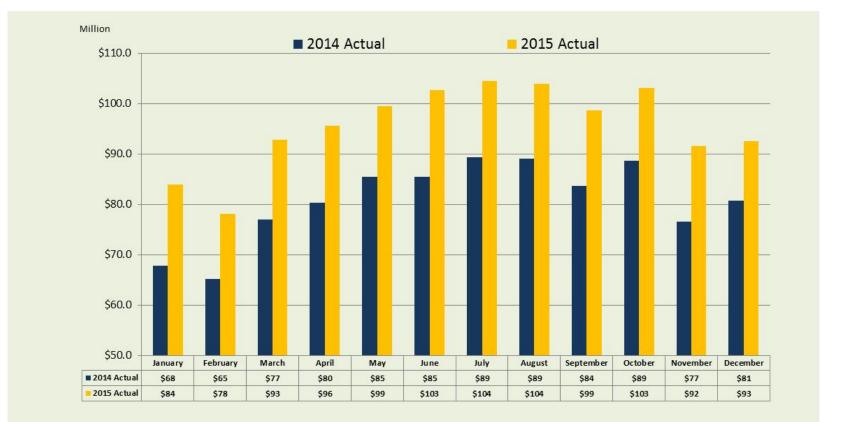

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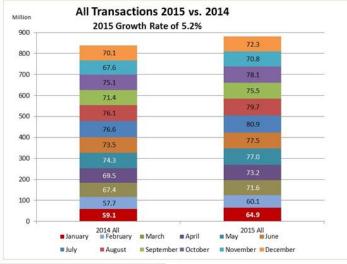

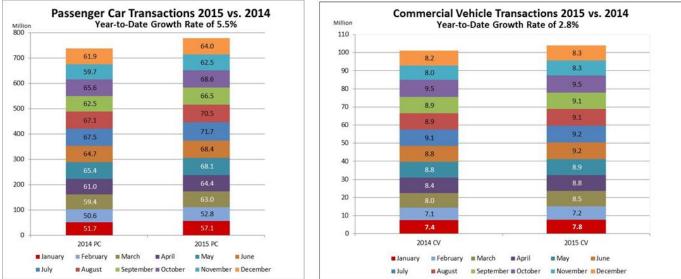
