Working with local organizations

Illiana

- IDOT public meetings
- Narrowed to one potential corridor
- Future discussion with Tollway Board



Process for Posting Proposed Policies

Background

Board to seek public input via email, U.S. mail or in-person

Process

Staff to work with committee and develop policy

- Post on website when officially introduced at committee
 - 48-hours in advance
- 21-day public comment period
 - Allows time to update prior to next committee meeting
- Provide comments to Directors and post on website
 - Within five-days of comment period close
- Policy approved at committee meeting



Traffic Noise Study and Abatement Policy Update Summary

- Based on lessons learned and updates in Federal Highway Administration and IDOT guidelines
- Follows same general principles as current policy, but more guidance
- Updates will be used for new projects
- Public review and comment period



Intergovernmental Agreement and Cost Share Policy

Types of Actions

- Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA)
 - Binding contract

Letter of Understanding (LOU)

- Simplified binding contract
- No proposed direct financial participation

Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)

Precursor to an Intergovernmental Agreement



Intergovernmental Agreements

Between 2005 and 2011

- 158 IGAs brought to Board
- 🖵 37 LOUs
- 🗖 4 MOUs
- 72 IGAs with reimbursement to the Tollway
 - □ \$106.7 million
- 50 IGAs with Tollway payment
 - 🗖 \$49.1 million

Additional IGAs with Move Illinois Program



Typical IGA Projects

- Interchanges
- Local agency roadway improvements
- New roadway
- Maintenance
- Stormsewer and other structures
- Lighting
- Bridges

- Multi-use path
- Traffic noise abatement walls
- Landscaping
- Signage
- Bird spikes
- Aesthetics



Cost Sharing Levels

New/Expanded Interchange

- □ Follow 2007 Interchange Policy
 - 50 percent maximum Tollway contribution
 - Based on net new revenue over a 10-year period
- Previous Intergovernmental Agreement
 Based on pre-approved jurisdiction
- Traffic noise abatement wall cost share
 Number of benefitted receptors
- Requested additions beyond base project
 Requesting agency covers 100 percent of cost



Reimbursement Options

Based on current practices

- Percentage due upon award and completion
 - 80 percent award/20 percent completion
 - 50 percent award/50 percent completion
 - 33 percent award/33 percent at midpoint/33 percent completion

Installments

- Payments throughout project with final due one year after completion/open to traffic
- Multi-year reimbursement
 - New Roadways Veterans Memorial Tollway (I-355)
 - Major Projects Reagan Memorial Tollway (I-88) at Naperville
 - New Interchanges



Reimbursement Schedule and Interest

- Preference is for self-financing
- Typically no interest assessed
- Interest applied if not paid in full by date
- Many projects with IGAs with IDOT
 Reimbursement
 Credit for IDOT-led projects
 - Project-by-project basis



Next Steps

- Develop policy for Move Illinois Program projects
- Strategic Planning Committee input
- Staff to prepare policy for review
 Legal, Finance, Engineering Departments
 Use past practices as guideline
- Consistent approach for Move Illinois Program projects
- Provide draft prior to next meeting
