


2015 Capital Program Highlights

- Largest year in the Tollway's history
- Anticipate \$1.63 billion in spending
 - Rebuild 310 lane miles of roads
 - Repair 122 bridges
 - Build or improve 20 interchanges
 - Create or sustain as many as 17,000 total jobs
- Enhance customer service
- Continue to build green









Jane Addams Memorial Tollway (I-90) Rebuilding and Widening Project

Spending \$839.6 million on I-90, more than half of the 2015 capital program budget

- Rebuild and widen 25 miles of outside lanes from the Elgin Toll Plaza to the Tri-State Tollway (I-294)
- Continue work on 10 interchange improvement projects, with plans to open Irene
 Road, Genoa Road and Lee Street interchanges by the end of the year
- Continue work on the Fox River Bridge Project







I-90 Upcoming Opportunities

- Major mainline contracts on I-90 eastern segment awarded so work can begin as soon as weather permits
- Additional mainline contracts, bridge work and possibly landscaping anticipated this fall

Eastbound I-90 over the Des Plaines River	Bridge work	\$5 to \$10
Roselle Road	Add westbound ramp	\$10 to \$15


Elgin O'Hare Western Access Project

Spending \$319.8 million

Expecting to deliver first phase of Illinois Route 390 Project by the end 2015

Continuing work on the I-290 Interchange and the Elmhurst Road Interchange

on I-90







Elgin O'Hare Western Access Project

- Reconstructing mainline roadway and improving various interchanges
- Two building demolition contracts advertised, additional opportunities forthcoming

Contract Location	Type of Work	Cost Magnitude (millions)
Various locations (two contracts, one small business set-aside contract)	Building demolition	\$0 to \$5
Lively Boulevard to Illinois Route 83	Mainline paving and interchange construction	\$25-50
Park Boulevard to Arlington Heights Road	Interchange and retaining/noisewall construction	\$50 to \$75





Reagan Memorial Tollway (I-88)

Spending \$108 million

- Resurfacing roadway and mainline bridges from U.S. Route 30 to Illinois Route 251
 - Providing a smoother surface, improving the overall driving experience and extending the life of the roadway
- Completion scheduled in 2016







I-88 Upcoming Opportunities

 Resurfacing projects on the western segment between Illinois Route 251 and U.S. Route 52 have been awarded; one being repackaged and rebid

Contract Location	Type of Work	Cost Magnitude (millions)
U.S. Route 30 and Illinois Route 52	Mainline paving	\$50 to 60
U.S. Route 30 and Illinois Route 52	Local crossroad bridge work	\$5 to \$10
Illinois Route 47 salt dome and DeKalb Data Center	Pavement repairs	\$0 to \$1 (small business set-aside contract)





Improvements Across the System

Spending \$241.1 million on systemwide improvements

- Completing the \$19.4 million Grand Avenue (Illinois Route 132) Interchange Project
 - Completion scheduled in 2015
- Constructing the Alsip (M-1) maintenance facility on I-294
 - First Tollway LEED-certified building
 - First maintenance facility to incorporate photovoltaic system
 - Opening in 2015





Improvements Across the System

- Alsip (M-1) maintenance facility reconstruction
- Various repairs along the Tri-State (I-294) corridor
- Majority of contracts less than \$5 million







Roadway and Streetscape Projects

- Arterial/Collector Streets: There are approximately 1000 miles of arterial/collector streets in the City of Chicago.
- CDOT has jurisdiction of over 565 miles of these arterials.
- Local Streets: Local streets are often resurfaced or reconstructed to address pothole problems or coordinate with adjacent development under the following Division of Engineering programs
 - WPA Program
 - Industrial Street Program
 - CHA New Streets Program
- Medians: City has 102 miles of landscaped medians of which CDOT maintains 85 miles and
 17 miles are maintained by others.
- ADA Ramps: Over 100,000 ramps in the city, CDOT has upgraded over 30,000 in the past years on their projects and will continue to include upgrades on applicable capital projects.

Diversity History and Mission

- Move Illinois and the creation of the Department of Diversity and Strategic Development
- Mission: to increase access to economic opportunities for disadvantaged, minority- and women-owned businesses, as well as underemployed individuals.





Goal Programs for Construction

- Disadvantaged Enterprise (DBE) Program
 - Illinois Unified Certification Program (IL-UCP) DBE Certifications (includes Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT), Chicago Transit Authority (CTA), Metra, Pace and City of Chicago)
 - City of Chicago Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) and Women-Owned Business Enterprise (WBE) Certification
 - Cook County MBE/WBE Certification
 - Small Business Administration SBA 8(a) Certification
- Veterans Business Program
 - Veteran-owned small business (VOSB)
 - Service-disabled, veteran-owned small business (SDVOSB)





Small Business Initiative

- Puts small businesses in a position to succeed and grow as prime contractors by
 - Identifying select construction contracts, generally with values of approximately \$1 million, that can be set aside specifically for small businesses
 - Establishing small business goals for select construction contracts on a project-by-project basis
- To qualify for participation in the Small Business Initiative, firms must meet the following criteria
 - Gross revenues of \$10 million or less annually
 - Register in the state's Small Business Set-Aside Program





Providing Technical Assistance

- Construction Business Development Center
 - Partnership with the Illinois Community College Board
 - Offers one-on-one support for small businesses
 - Develops flexible, customized training and technical assistance
- Construction Coaching for Growth Program
 - Partnership with the Illinois Hispanic Chamber of Commerce and the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
 - Structured, three-month, course-based intensive training program
 - Specific eligibility requirements
- Small Contractor Bridge Program
 - Partnership with the Illinois Finance Authority and the Chicago Community Loan Fund
 - Provides access to bonding and capital loans for small contractors





Workforce Development Programs


- Earned Credit Program
 - Earn bid credits toward future
 Tollway construction bids
 - Participate by hiring from a pool of pre-screened job candidates



- Transportation Construction Apprenticeship Readiness Training Program (TCART)
 - Get reimbursed a portion of the hourly wages paid to eligible employees
 - TCART candidates have received pre-apprenticeship training
 - Many TCART candidates are also ECP eligible
