



Commercial Truck Toll Evasion

Annual lost revenue \$10 – 12 million

Accounts for more than 90 percent of all toll evasion citations

More than 50 percent haul containers

Toll evasion

- Commercial toll violators view toll evasion as a way to save money
- Average evasion ticket is \$120
- Ticketing does not impact compliance

Achieving driver compliance

- Court time has greatest impact
 - Missed work = lost income
 - Additional court fines and fees
 - Accumulated points on license

Recessed and off center

Out of camera range

Bent under bumper







VARIETY OF EVASION TECHNIQUES Plate obstruction

Numbers covered with grease

Numbers defaced

Cover distorts photos







Other Evasion Techniques

- Missing plate
- Special rigging
- Swinging plate
- Bent plate
- Cut plate (remove a number)
