Award of Contract 18-0152R to Law Enforcement Systems, LLC for the purchase of Non-Illinois License Plate Registration Retrieval Services in an amount not to exceed \$4,005,000.00 for an initial three-year term and a possible renewal term for a three-year period, in an amount not to exceed \$4,005,000.00 (Tollway Request for Proposal).
