Illinois State Police Announce Results of Alcohol Countermeasure Enforcement Patrols in DuPage, Kane and McHenry Counties

Downers Grove, IL – Illinois State Police District 15 Commander Jason Bradley announced today enforcement figures for Alcohol Countermeasure Enforcement Patrols (ACE) conducted between March 13 and March 20 on the Jane Addams Memorial Tollway (I-90) in Kane and McHenry counties and the Reagan Memorial Tollway (I-88) in DuPage and Kane counties.

According to Illinois Secretary of State statistics from 2019, more than 26,000 individuals were arrested for driving under the influence (DUI) and 289 drivers under the age of 21 were suspended under the zero-tolerance statute for driving with a blood-alcohol concentration of more than .00 or for refusing to submit to chemical testing. The goals of the ACE program are to reduce the incidence of DUI, alcohol-related violations and the illegal consumption/possession of alcohol and other drugs by minors. DUI and all other alcohol related violations are 100 percent preventable crimes. The Illinois State Police has a zero-tolerance approach to these violators. If you are arrested for DUI or are under the age of 21 and have been drinking, you could have your license suspended and your vehicle impounded.
