Illinois State Police Announce Alcohol Countermeasure Enforcement Patrols in Cook, DuPage, Kane and Will Counties

Downers Grove, IL – Illinois State Police District 15 Interim Commander Jason Bradley announced today that officers will conduct Alcohol Countermeasure Enforcement (ACE) patrols between July 2 and July 5 on the Jane Addams Memorial Tollway (I-90) in Cook and Kane counties and the Veterans Memorial Tollway (I-355) in DuPage and Will counties.

Illinois Secretary of State statistics for 2018 revealed that more than 26,000 individuals were arrested for driving under the influence (DUI) and 28 percent of all fatal motor vehicle crashes involved alcohol. The ACE program focuses enforcement efforts on drivers who are impaired and underage minors who are illegally consuming or possessing alcohol. These patrols will be conducted during nighttime hours when impaired driving occur at the highest rate.

Illinois State Police Troopers will have a zero-tolerance approach to drivers who are driving impaired and underage drivers who have consumed alcohol. Drivers who are arrested for DUI may have their vehicle impounded and face suspension of their driving privileges for up to one year for a first offense. Drivers who are convicted of DUI may face fines of up to \$2,500 and possible imprisonment for up to one year for first convictions. Penalties for subsequent convictions of DUI include possible imprisonment for up to 12 years and fines of up to \$25,000 if crashes cause great bodily harm or permanent disfigurement to other persons. Underage drivers who are found to be driving with a blood alcohol concentration over .00 can have their license suspended for 3 months for a first offense.
