

This year marked the 12th year of Move Illinois, a multi-year capital program to rebuild, expand and modernize the Tollway. We invested more than \$1 billion throughout the system, helping to create new opportunities for businesses of all sizes and provided communities with access to the transportation network necessary to grow and thrive.

Our success begins with the exemplary work of our dedicated employees, who serve and safeguard our customers. They clear roads during winter storms and assist customers who need a helping hand when traveling on our system. Others diligently assist drivers who call or visit our customer service centers and operate the IT systems that keep our system running.

We remain committed to providing our customers exemplary service by offering cashless tolling using I-PASS, Pay-By-Plate services and interoperability with E-ZPass for seamless travel across the country, and increasing access for all to our system through I-PASS Assist.

The Tollway is grateful for the support offered by its stakeholders and partners, particularly the local communities, industry associations, business and environmental groups it works closely with when planning and implementing roadway improvements. Our success also stems from the close cooperation provided by other transportation and transit agencies.

ADVANCING TOLLING

The Tollway is a user-fee system – no state or federal tax dollars are used to support maintenance and operations. Operations are funded by toll revenues collected from customers paying electronically with I-PASS or E-ZPass transponders or online though the Tollway's Pay By Plate service.




Training and Mentoring Businesses

As part of its commitment to inclusion, the Tollway expanded successful initiatives like its Technical Assistance and Partnering for Growth programs to provide training and mentoring to more small and diverse businesses to help those firms flourish. Assisting those firms in 2023 will help create a larger pool of qualified businesses able to compete for Tollway contracts in the future, which in turn will help hold down Tollway costs for future work.

















Good People Doing Great Things

The exemplary quality and commitment of Team Tollway continued both on the job and after hours. It was after hours that an observant employee noticed a distressed person who was choking. Without hesitation he performed the Heimlich maneuver, dislodging the obstruction in the person's airway. Another team tollway member who is passionate about honoring our veterans noticed neglected headstones and volunteered his off hours to clean these final resting places. Yet another Team Tollway member became aware of community residents who faced hardship in finding food for their families and used his collaborative skills to organize food drives and distribution to alleviate hunger for those in crisis.

ENABLING ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND COMMUNITY CONNECTIVITY

In 2023, the Tollway built new roads, bridges and interchanges to improve and expand our system, but we did much more. We support the communities we serve and generate economic growth in our region. We built better connections between local communities and businesses, and we created new opportunities for small and diverse companies to grow by participating in Tollway projects and we continued to engage our stakeholders throughout the year.

The work done in 2023 showed that we not only provide a world-class roadway system for our 1.6 million daily drivers, we serve as an economic engine that enables people, businesses and communities to continue moving forward.

We continued to rebuild and widen portions of the Central Tri-State Tollway, including reconfiguring the I-290/I-88 Interchange at I-294 to remove decades-old bottlenecks that slow traffic and create safety hazards.


The Tollway system is a vital link for regional and national freight traffic as well as a crossroads for commuters and local drivers connecting to other expressways and major highways. 2023 economic activity along the Tollway was announced in Hazel Crest, Rolling Meadows, Huntley, DeKalb, Hoffman Estates.








DRIVING SAFETY


Through all the construction this year, the Tollway focused on safety, maintaining the same number of open lanes to reduce bottlenecks and traffic hazards for drivers while still creating safe work zones for construction workers.



During extreme weather conditions during the winter and summer, we deployed Zero Weather Road Patrols and Hot Weather Patrols to search for and quickly assist stranded drivers in 2023.

- Zero Weather Road Patrol assists More than 1.100
- Hot Weather Patrol assists: More than 1,600

To better manage emergency situations, we developed the TIMS2Go app, which provides our incident management team with immediate access to video images and other data from the Traffic Operations Center. When seconds count, this tool—which won multiple national safety awards—allows the incident management team to rapidly respond as critical situations evolve on the roadway.



DELIVERING CONSTRUCTION

Move Illinois: The Illinois Tollway Driving the Future, continues to improve mobility, relieve congestion, reduce pollution and create as many as 165,220 jobs and link economies throughout the region. The first 12 years of Move Illinois are on schedule and within budget. Progress continues on projects addressing the remaining needs of the existing Tollway system, delivering the new I-490 Tollway Project and reconstruction of the Central Tri-State Tollway (I-294).

Construction and Professional Services Contract Awards

Throughout 2023, the Illinois Tollway did its part to help keep businesses running and people working as we work to deliver roadway and infrastructure improvements to our customers.

In all, 57 construction and professional engineering services contracts totaling \$534 million were approved by the Tollway Board in 2023.

- 52 of the 57 or 91 percent of all construction and professional engineering services contracts awarded were unbundled or Small Business Initiative contracts that provided opportunities for small, diverse and veteran-owned firms to take on roles as prime contractors and consultants.
 - 41 construction contracts
 - 11 professional engineering services contracts



ADVANCING DIVERSITY

The Illinois Tollway is a driving force for increasing economic opportunities providing small, diverse and veteran businesses and individuals with opportunities to grow and succeed through training programs, business assistance and strategic partnerships.

DEMONSTRATING SUSTAINABILITY

In 2023, the Tollway demonstrated its strong commitment to sustainability through its innovative practices related to recycling and reusing materials from our operations and other industries by finding a new purpose for them, reducing the burden on our local landfills. Old aggregates and concrete are reused and recycled to create new pavement bases, and industrial slag, shingles and old tires are recycled into new pavement. Our Environmental team continues to engage in environmental mitigation through wetland restoration, stream enhancement and native planting programs to help restore and improve our communities' natural resources.

BUILDING A STUDENT PIPELINE

The Illinois Tollway is committed to building a pipeline of qualified and talented workers, encouraging students to pursue careers in construction and engineering.

The Tollway Internship Program continues expanding to develop the next generation of transportation professionals, providing college students and recent graduates with realworld experiences in a wide range of agency departments.

The Tollway also provides boots-on-the-ground experiences for area high school students at major construction sites and maintenance facilities. Site visits showcase career paths available for students right in their own backyards in both STEM careers and in the skilled trades, including auto mechanics, carpenters and electricians.

To address the growing need for construction workers, the Tollway expanded outreach for its ConstructionWorks program, hosting a series of information sessions in several South Side communities to increase awareness about career assistance available for diverse men and women ready to enter careers in the heavy highway construction industry.









2023 Sources of Revenue


The Illinois Tollway is a user-funded system that receives no state or federal funding for maintenance and operations.



2023 Allocation of Revenue

Allocations are made from revenue collected on a cash basis and may differ from revenue that is booked on an accrual basis

\$1.0 billion in Capital Program Expenditures are for roadway reconstruction, expansion and systemwide maintenance. Does not reflect reimbursements received pursuant to intergovernmental agreement. The capital program is also funded by proceeds from bond sales.


