




UPCOMING UNBUNDLED AND SMALL BUSINESS OPPORTUNITIES




UNBUNDLED AND SMALL BUSINESS SET-ASIDE CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS

- Awarded 120 contracts under \$5 million and 26 Small Business Set-Aside contracts since 2012
 - Breaks up larger projects into a range of contract sizes and types
 - Creates opportunities for small and diverse firms to compete for Tollway work as primes
- Continue to review types of opportunities that best fit criteria for unbundled and set-aside projects
 - Factors include safety, efficiency, scope and availability of contractors
- Tollway will be implementing small business goals and "zero" goals on select construction contracts








JOB ORDER CONTRACTING FACILITIES PROGRAM



TOLLWAY FACILITIES SERVICES




- Facilities Services responsible for 107 facilities
 - 11 maintenance sites
 - 20 miscellaneous structures
 - Tollway headquarters
 - Central warehouse
 - Sign shop
 - Disaster recovery building
 - Central support complex
 - 24 attended mainline toll plazas
 - 54 unattended ramp toll plazas

 Includes lighting, heating, air conditioning and ventilation systems, electrical, plumbing and sewers




JOC FACILITIES PROGRAM



- Allows the Tollway to complete facilities-related projects in a timely and costeffective manner
- Invites general contractors to bid competitively for opportunities to perform tasks related to facility construction and repair
- Includes work on Tollway facilities including headquarters building, maintenance sites and toll plazas
- Awards contracts to perform work as needed without traditional design and procurement process
- Provides smaller projects for subcontractors, including small and diverse firms




SUBCONTRACTOR BENEFITS



- Why JOC works for subcontractors
 - Quick responsiveness requires multiple local subcontractors
 - Wide range of projects means variety of subcontractors
 - Results in greater number of subcontractor opportunities
 - Multiple projects on multiple sites simultaneously




HOW IS WORK DONE?



- Joint scope meeting with the owner, contractor and others to define the detailed scope of work
- The owner issues a job order proposal request
- Proposal development
 - Typical proposal due date two weeks from the job order proposal request
- Proposal review






GOAL PROGRAMS



- Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program
 - Disadvantaged, minority- and women-owned business enterprise and Small Business Administration SBA 8(a) firms
- Veterans Business Program
 - Veteran-owned small business (VOSB)
 - Service-disabled, veteran-owned small business (SDVOSB)
- Business Enterprise Program (BEP)
 - Certified with the Central Management Services BEP Program
 - 51 percent owned and controlled by a minority, woman or disabled person
 - Owner must be a U.S. citizen or resident alien
 - Annual gross sales must be less than \$75 million




SMALL BUSINESS INITIATIVE



- Puts small businesses in position to succeed and grow as prime contractors
 - Identify select construction contracts, generally with values of approximately \$1 million, that can be set aside specifically for small businesses
 - Establish small business goals for select construction contracts on a projectby-project basis
- To qualify for participation in the Small Business Initiative, firms must meet the following criteria
 - Gross revenues of \$14 million or less annually
 - Register in the state's Small Business Set-Aside Program




PROPOSED VETERANS INITIATIVES



- Partner with federal, state and local agencies to host outreach events targeted to veteran-owned firms
- Review veteran goals on construction and professional services contracts
- Pursue Veteran Set-Aside Program for construction
- Establish workforce credit for hiring veterans
- Firms hiring and retaining non-Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act eligible veterans would earn credits for future bids similar to ECP credits




TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE



- Construction Business Development Center
 - Partnership with the Illinois Community College Board
 - Offers one-on-one support for small businesses
 - Develops flexible, customized training and technical assistance
- Construction Coaching for Growth Program
 - Partnership with the Illinois Hispanic Chamber of Commerce and the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
 - Structured, three-month, course-based intensive training program
 - Specific eligibility requirements
- Small Contractor Bridge Program
 - Partnership with the Illinois Finance Authority and the Chicago Community Loan Fund
 - Provides access to bonding and capital loans for small contractors



NEW TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE




 Intensive, long-term 'mentorship' type technical assistance over multiple years designed to help firms succeed as prime contractors
