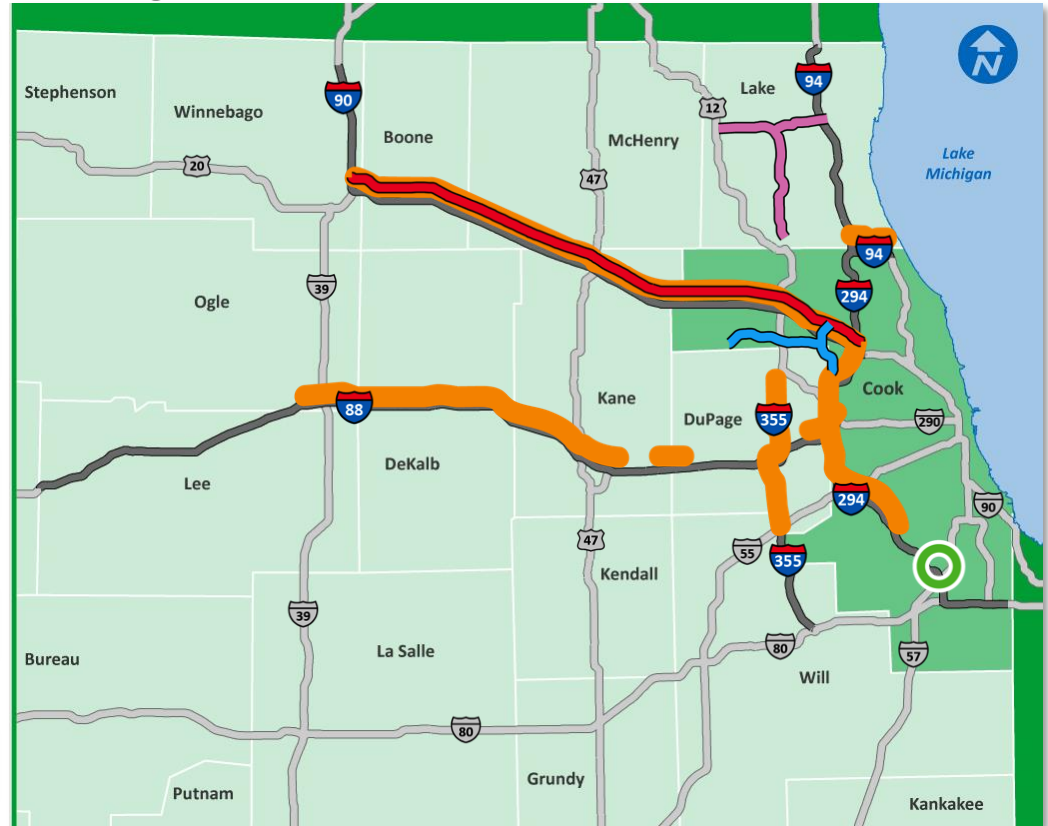

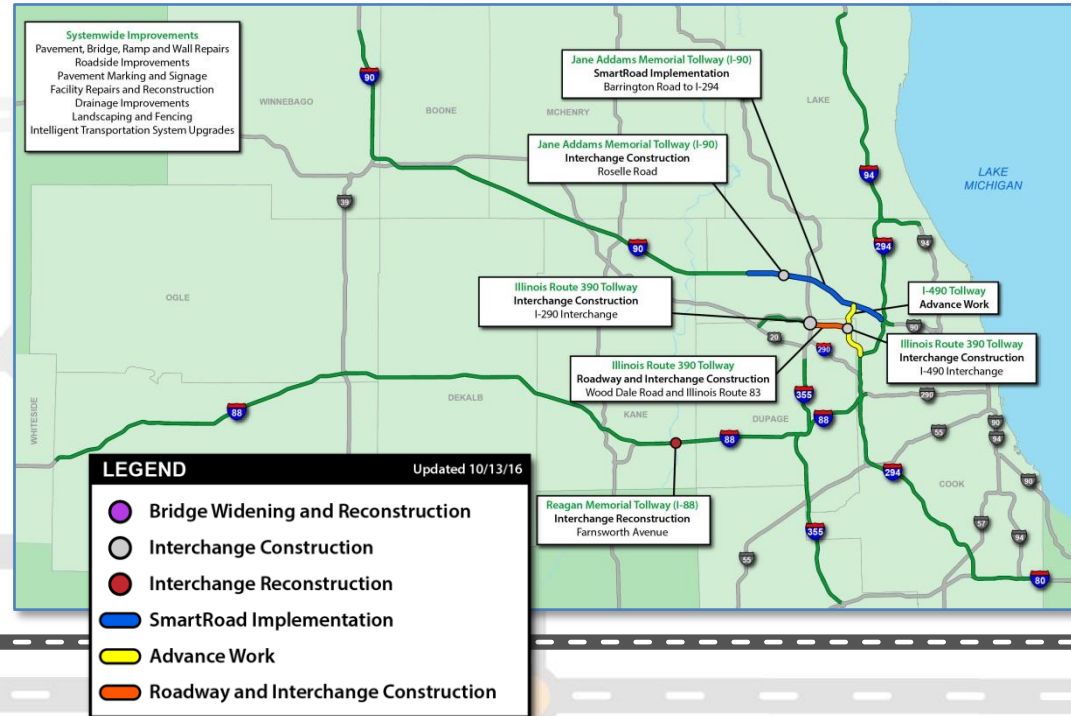

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PROFESSIONAL SERVICES BULLETIN (PSB)

- PSB lists opportunities available
- Interested firms submit a Statement of Interest detailing
 - Demonstrated ability of personnel
 - Past experience, record and performance data
 - References, reputation and resources
 - Workload and ability to meet time constraints
- PSB available on the Tollway's website under Doing Business

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SELECTION PROCESS

- Qualifications-based selection
 - Selection based on qualifications, skills and expertise, as opposed to a low bid
 - Negotiation of a fair and reasonable fee for services
- Comprehensive selection process
 - Interested firms submit a Statement of Interest
 - Formal process internally
 - Tollway negotiates fee with top firm
 - Chief Engineer provides award recommendation to Board of Directors

The new State of Illinois eProcurement System - BidBuy Deployment

The State of Illinois is proud to announce the implementation of a web-based eProcurement system called, BidBuy. State agencies will use BidBuy to advertise solicitation opportunities, evaluate bids, and publish contract awards. It will become the State's primary solution for sourcing and placing orders from vendors for the CPO - General Services.

BidBuy will replace the current Illinois Procurement Bulletin - General Services (IPB) and link directly with the Illinois Procurement Gateway (IPG).

Implementation will take place in two phases:

1. Phase 1(Starting Tomorrow!): **Vendor Registration** - Registration opens allowing vendors to create and manage their business' information in BidBuy.
2. Phase 2(August, 2016): **Full Procurement** - State agencies use BidBuy to complete small purchases, post solicitations, and award contracts. Vendors view and respond to solicitations and manage purchase.

Most current contracts will be migrated to BidBuy. In order to continue to do business with the State, you must register in BidBuy before Full Procurement implementation in July, 2016. The State is opening Vendor Registration now to allow enough time to register as many interested vendors as possible.

NOTE: If you currently have a contract with a state agency that will be active after July 1, 2016, please register by May 1, 2016. This will help us in loading your contracts in BidBuy.

How to Register in BidBuy if you have a valid registration in the Illinois Procurement Gateway (IPG)

NOTE: If you have a valid Illinois Procurement Gateway registration number and expiration date, you will also receive instructions via email to login and activate your BidBuy account and complete your registration.

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PROCUREMENT APPROACHES

- Invitation for Bid (IFB)
 - Awarded to lowest, responsible and responsive bidder
- Request for Proposal (RFP)
 - Awarded to vendor that provides the best value
- RFP Professional and Artistic (RFP P&A)
 - Qualified by education, experience and technical ability

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SMALL BUSINESS SET-ASIDE PROGRAM

- What is a set-aside? Why is it beneficial?
- How does the program work?
 - 673 product and service categories
 - \$50,900 one-time purchase – most any product or service qualifies
 - Any other procurement the Chief Procurement Office deems appropriate to set aside
- Firms are listed in the small business database

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BUSINESS ENTERPRISE PROGRAM (BEP)

- Qualifications
 - At least 51 percent owned and controlled by persons who are minority, women or designated as disabled
 - Must be a U.S. citizen or resident alien
 - Annual gross sales of less than \$75 million
- BEP goal participation is considered on solicitations \$50,000 and above
 - cms.diversitycompliance.com/

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ILLINOIS PROCUREMENT GATEWAY

- Accepts disclosures and certifications
- Minimizes risk of vendor disqualification for administrative errors at the time of bid opening
- Creates an electronic company record that may be updated at any time

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BIDBUY

- State's new eProcurement System
 - Vendor registration now open
 - Will replace current Illinois Procurement Bulletin (IPB)
 - Transition from IPB to BidBuy expected to occur later this year

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TOLLWAY FACILITIES SERVICES

- Facilities Services responsible for 107 facilities
 - 11 maintenance sites
 - 20 miscellaneous structures
 - Tollway headquarters
 - Central warehouse
 - Sign shop
 - Disaster recovery building
 - Central support complex
 - 24 attended mainline toll plazas
 - 54 unattended ramp toll plazas
- Includes lighting, heating, air conditioning and ventilation systems, electrical, plumbing and sewers

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JOC FACILITIES PROGRAM

- Allows the Tollway to complete facilities-related projects in a timely and cost-effective manner
- Invites general contractors to bid competitively for opportunities to perform tasks related to construction and repair of various Tollway facilities
- Includes work on Tollway facilities including headquarters building, maintenance sites and toll plazas
- Awards contracts to perform work as needed without traditional design and procurement process
- Provides smaller projects for subcontractors, including small and diverse firms

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SUBCONTRACTOR BENEFITS

- Why JOC works for subcontractors
 - Quick responsiveness requires multiple local subcontractors
 - Wide range of projects means variety of subcontractors
 - Results in greater number of subcontractor opportunities

Job Order Contracting

OVERVIEW

The Job Order Contracting (JOC) Facilities Program enables the Illinois Tollway to accomplish facility repairs and construction with a single, competitively bid contract, eliminating the time and expense of the typical design-bid-construct cycle for each project. General contractors competitively bid from a catalog of construction tasks with pre-set unit prices. The JOC Facilities Program allows the Illinois Tollway to decrease project duration and cost, while increasing quality.

In February 2016, the Illinois Tollway awarded eight general contractors five-year contracts to perform various facility repair and construction projects throughout the Tollway system. In most cases, the general contractors rely on sub-contractors to perform tasks related to each project.

General contractors have a 25 percent Business Enterprise Program (BEP) goal and a 3 percent veteran goal for the term of the contract. Subcontractors interested in participating in JOC projects need to contact the general contractor directly.

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PROPOSED VETERANS INITIATIVES

- Pursue Veteran Set-Aside Program for construction
- Establish workforce credit for hiring veterans
 - Firms hiring and retaining non-Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act eligible veterans would earn credits for future bids similar to Earned Credit Program credits
- Expanding Partnering for Growth to construction contracts
